As the parish is a full member of TCC, parishioners are encouraged to participate in their activities, and you would be welcome to join the accountability meetings to learn more about the candidates and their views about how they might influence both local and national issues.

We hope to see you at the PAC meeting, your views are important and your contribution will be even more so, and if you're not at the TCC accountability meeting, please do come to the PAC.



#### Year 9 Retreat Day St Joseph's High School.

The Sion Community, based in Brentwood in Essex, were invited to come to school to work with the Yr 9 pupils on their retreat day. The children were assembled in the school hall while the Community led prayers through song, drama and discussion. The Sion Community is a missionary community of laity and clergy who are inspired by the Holy Spirit in the work they do in the community. Throughout the day the pupils attended workshops devised and led by the various members of the group, these included praying through art, team building, drama and communicating prayer by "singing" and "signing" and a session directed at the boys in the year group to help them explore their roles as men in society and how Jesus is a role model for them.

The pupils always enjoy outside visitors coming to school and they responded very well, engaging in the workshops and discussions in an interested and mature way. Of course, we do not know the seeds we sow for the future, but we provide the opportunities where our pupils can discover and decide for themselves the directions of their lives.
